






How does it work and what do I need to provide?

- Register for our free portal at www.inheritancedata.co.uk
- Log in to your account and fill in our simple online submission form with known details of the deceased
- Upload a signed Letter of Authority using our portal template
- Add the death certificate and Will or Letters of Administration (intestate estates can also be accepted)
- Submit the search
- You can log into your secure account on the online portal to check matches and no matches 24/7. Each report shows all the institutions that have responded, along with details to help with the claiming process. The online report is available from day one of the search and there is a map of the estate's financial history
